



### Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction

#### 1 оитсоме

The substantial reduction of disaster risk and losses in lives, livelihoods and health and in the economic, physical, social, cultural and environmental assets of persons, businesses, communities and countries

### 1 GOAL

Prevent new and reduce existing disaster risk through the implementation of integrated and inclusive economic, structural, legal, social, health, cultural, educational, environmental, technological, political and institutional measures that prevent and reduce hazard exposure and vulnerability to disaster, increase preparedness for response and recovery, and thus strengthen resilience

#### 4 PRIORITIES

Understanding disaster risk

Investing in disaster risk reduction for resilience

Strengthening disaster risk governance to manage disaster risk

Enhancing disaster preparedness for effective response, and to "Build Back Better" in recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction

### **International Cooperation**

- Global Target (f) Substantially enhance international cooperation to developing countries through adequate and sustainable support to complement their national actions for implementation of the Sendai Framework by 2030.
- A set of <u>38 indicators</u> were identified to measure global progress in the implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction.
- 8 indicators for International Cooperation.



# **International Cooperation - indicators**

#	Indicator
F1	Total official international support, (official development
F3	assistance (ODA) plus other official flows), for <b>national disaster risk reduction actions</b> : (1) <i>Provision or receipt by/to a country,</i> (2) by <b>multilateral agencies</b> , (3) <b>bilaterally</b> .
F4	Total official international support (ODA plus other official flows) for the <b>transfer and exchange of disaster risk reduction-related technology</b> .
F5	Number of international, regional and bilateral programmes and initiatives for the transfer and exchange of science, technology and innovation in disaster risk reduction for developing countries.



# **International Cooperation - indicators**

#	Indicator
F6	Total official international support (ODA plus other official flows) for disaster risk reduction <b>capacity-building</b> .
F7	Number of international, regional and bilateral programmes and initiatives for disaster risk reduction-related capacity-building in developing countries.
F8	Number of developing countries supported by international, regional and bilateral initiatives to strengthen their disaster risk reduction-related statistical capacity.



# **International Cooperation - Opportunities**

International cooperation for DRR includes a variety of sources and can be achieved in diverse ways:

- Enhance technology transfer, involving a process of enabling and facilitating flows of skill, knowledge, ideas, know-how and technology
- North-South cooperation, complemented by South-South and triangular cooperation, has proven to be key to reducing disaster risk and there is a need to further strengthen cooperation in both areas.

# **International Cooperation - Opportunities**

- Coherence global partnership for sustainable development
- Example: UN Plan of Action on Disaster Risk Reduction for Resilience: Towards a Risk-informed and Integrated Approach to Sustainable Development
- Public and private investment in disaster risk prevention and reduction through structural and non-structural measures are required to enhance the resilience of persons, communities, countries and their assets, as well as the environment.



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
